As many of you know Puerto Rico is reeling from Hurricane Maria. The storm knocked out the island's entire aging power grid, blocked roads and left entire communities isolated. As of today (9/28), 80% of the cell phone towers are still down and it could take months for full electrical power to be restored. Water systems are down and emergency systems are scarce. Please be praying for these issues to be resolved quickly.

Thankfully, we have been able to communicate with our members in Puerto Rico, and all disciples are reported as safe despite extremely difficult living conditions. Our brothers and sisters in Puerto Rico are facing a long period of recovery from Hurricane Maria, and your help is needed now more than ever.
