BACKGROUND

Matthew 28: 18 – 20 *Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."*

MISSION PRIORITIES

a. Campus ministry

The Leadership Team (LT) is determined to sustain and build an even more vibrant campus ministry! Each mission focus identified in this summary is vitally important. However, due to the potential for global impact, the LT challenges the church to sustain a resource emphasis toward the campuses of the Valley.

b. Local missions (other than campus) - Four intentional areas of local outreach and planning:

- Youth and family (Y&F) – spiritually guiding our youth contributes to overall church health.
- Urban (i.e., Springfield) – our facility limitations in Chicopee will require a second worship center.
- Singles – an increasing population secularly, but historically underemphasized in the church.
- Spanish Small Group – the demographics of the Valley necessitates this emphasis.

c. European Mission Society

PVCC commits to continued resource support of EMS.

d. 2020 Vision planting

In our affiliation with the New England ICOC churches, we support the regional plan to reach into areas of New England which do not currently have disciples meeting.

PLAN

1. 2017 – Days of fasting and prayer on the first Wednesdays of each month
2. Communicate clearly to the church about the budget needs to accomplish plans.
3. Annually (during the fourth quarter) assess where the church is in regard to accomplishing these mission visions and communicate to the church.
4. Y/F Ministry – regularly communicate to the church about the focus on the need for mentors and volunteers to actively engage the youth.
5. EMS Mission Zealot - regularly promote and communicate international mission efforts to the church.
